

The Bassett Down Bucket Hoard

Kirsty Hartsiotis has recently joined the team at Swindon Museums as a Collections and Exhibitions Officer. Before her talk on the Arts and Crafts Movement she was able to show us the contents of the Bucket Hoard, recently acquired by Museum and Art Swindon. The bucket itself was too fragile to be shown. The contents included a large and a small drinking cup and a beautiful jug, all made from a copper alloy. The Friends paid for the micro-excavation of the bucket and it's contents, which will be put on show next year.
