Artists in Purbeck: Spirit of Place, and how a junk shop purchase led to me attending the exhibition opening

Earlier this year I was in Lyme Regis and saw a sign to an 'antique centre', the sign was a bit misleading as it was more like a jumble than an antique shop. My eye caught a small brown pot with a tag saying 'Local potter £6' there were some marks on the base and a sticker saying Amy Krauss, Corfe Castle. I had no idea who she was, so when I got it home I started doing some research. It turns out she was an artist of some note during the inter war period. She started off as a painter and later took up pottery. She was commissioned to paint a watercolour for the library of the royal dolls house at Windsor Castle in 1923. She was also a close friend of arguably the most famous painter from New Zealand, Frances Hodgkins. As part of my research, I posted a picture on the Facebook British Studio Pottery Collectors Group. A few months later I got a message saying that Dr Gill Clarke was trying to find anyone willing to lend work by Krauss for an exhibition at the Russell Coates Museum in Bournemouth that she was curating and could she put me in touch with her. I knew Gill from her talks to the Friends, so I said yes. In the ensuing email exchange Gill and I shared what we knew about Krauss. I told her about a more recent potter who had a studio in the Old Forge in Corfe, Ian Harris. Gill didn't know of him but had a painting of the Old Forge for the exhibition, so I ended up loaning the work I had by him as well.

As a lender I was invited to the opening of Artists in Purbeck: Spirit of Place. It's a fantastic exhibition featuring some important artists from the past as well as contemporary artists. There are several works by Frances Hodgkins as well as others I admire such as Paul Nash and Roger Fry. Gill gave an excellent speech including some of the challenges in staging such as borrowing a work from the Government Art Collection that turned out to be hanging in No 10. I'm really looking forward to hearing more from her when she talks to the Friends about the exhibition, I think we are in for a treat.

If you are lucky enough to get to visit the exhibition look out for two small pots in one of the cases that say they are on loan from a 'private collection'.
