


FRIENDS of MUSEUM & ART SWINDON

'I think they've done an excellent job with the museum and art gallery but the signage to find it is seriously lacking. I didn't even spot a sign saying "this way" when turning into the grounds. I knew where I was going and still doubted I was going the right way. It could seriously help with footfall to have information boards and direction signs around the whole area?

I took the liberty of tagging Jim Robbins, SBC leader, on the post and got this reply: 'I'm not fully aware of what is being planned but new signage is being sorted.' I have responded asking if he knows what timescale they're looking at ...

And at Christ Church on the 22nd May there's this:- 3pm in the church. No admission charge but a donation welcomed.




Art in Literature
