





#### Friends Donate to Henry Orlik Acquisition

In September the Friends donated £3,000 to Museum & Art Swindon to support the aquisition of the Henry Orlik work *Eggs Unhatched on the Sun*. The work will be exhibited in a forthcoming exhibition at Museum & Art Swindon.

Orlik, now 78, caused excitement in the art world as a young, man when be was exhibited alongside René Magritte, Salvadoe Dali and Max Ernst. After the caused star fell out with an art dealer, he became a recluse, painting alone in his south London flat. Orlik is now enjoying a renaissance with his works selling at exhibitions, put together by Grant Ford at Winsor Birch, in both the UK and New York.

Orlik is a surrealist, often showing monumental structures and flowing forms but as the viewer moves closer, the subtle shading becomes a sea of intricate, colourful marks, each one perfect. You can only wonder at the meticulous devotion to produce these works.



#### Exhibition Review: Lines of Influence at The Base, Greenham

Lines of Influence: Twentieth Century Printmaking British is superb celebration of the craft and creativity that defined British printmaking across the last century.

The exhibition brings together striking linocuts, etchings, andithographs artists such as C.R.W. Nevinson, Eric Ravilious, Dame Elisabeth Frink, Sybil Andrews, and Edward Bawden -



revealing how printmakers shaped the look and feel of modern Britain.

Beautifully curated, the show highlights both the artistic and everyday uses of print — from fine art to posters and book design — while exploring how these works reflect social change and visual innovation. Bold, colourful, and accessible, it's a joy for both art enthusiasts and newcomers alike.



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Alongside the exhibition, The Base offers talks, workshops, and relaxed sessions that make the experience even richer. Lines of Influence is a thoughtful and inspiring look at the power of print — well worth a visit.

## **Experiencing Swindon Open Studios**

I have a feeling of reverence to be given the opportunity to peer into the inner workings of an artists studio. Not all of the artists show their studio. With some it is a gallery (front room/kitchen etc.) of finished works but when artists open their studio, it's an added bonus for me.

With nearly one hundred artists, from in and around Swindon, my visit programme had to be efficient particularly as I only had one weekend. The wonderfully produced event booklet and map was immensely useful and made it easy to plan and get around. I did however bite off more than I could chew and didn't get to see all of my selection even though I got home at 8pm on the Saturday. I could have spent hours talking to the artists and I suppose I probably did.

I only know a few of the artists, so for me I was guided by the promotional picture against each artist in the booklet. So that needs to be a good one. After that it was geography.

To say I enjoyed my two days of open studio would be an understatement. I loved it. Artists were happy to talk about their work and journey. Above all, I saw some incredible art. Open Studios Swindon is a 'must have' and a way to access the incredible talent in Swindon. The ability of the artists, the quality of the work and the diversity of style and technique was all on display. Artsite in Theatre Square was a microcosm of the diversity of styles with great work on display.

Any disappointment? Yes. Not getting to see all of my choices and I wish I could have bought everything I liked. I had my heart set on visiting Ken White and was saddened when he wasn't well enough to participate.

After two days I was fortunate to end at the studio of Tim Baynes, a prolific member of the Guild of Wiltshire Artists. With much

Thank you Tim and to all the artists in the Swindon Open Studio.


### Featured Artist - David Bent Hon CRAgeS

After visiting Swindon Open Studios and being struck by the quantity and quality of artistic talent that abounds in Swindon, Andrew Cross thought a featured artist section would be interesting.

We decided to start with David Bent in part as a selection of his vast body of work relates to our October talk – and more of that below.

Living and working in Swindon, David is renowned for his aviation art, including his Aerobots, but he has far more bristles to his brush than that.

David's body of work is diverse, a well-travelled man, much of his work reflects his travel experiences. And his love of nature is clear too, in many of his art works, including the landscape geometry series of paintings, one of which: Beach House West of Looe is held within the Swindon Museum and Art Collection.

Social issues make their way onto David's canvas too, in the form of response work. I'm thinking here of his painting of the Grenfell tower disaster and 9/11. But I'm also thinking of his Movement 2000 collection. This set of eight powerful, harrowing and haunting paintings that David produced as we headed towards the new century. Depicting the movement of souls displaced through no fault of their own, the works are tragically as relevant to the world now as they were then.
